Strategies for College Success



Learning about Colleges and Degree Programs

- Take a "virtual tour" of colleges that interest you, or visit a local college with your parents.
- Explore college majors and programs of study.
- Start ranking your college choices based on your preferences.



Preparing for College in High School

- Enroll in advanced coursework, such as Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate classes, and dual credit options offered by a local community college.
- Take the PSAT, ACT Aspire and/or the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) college readiness exams.
- Prepare for the SAT and/or ACT.



Building a College Resume

- Get involved in extracurricular activities and community service opportunities (colleges look for students who are active leaders in their schools).
- Participate in a summer enrichment program (check out local universities and your local school district for opportunities).

Exploring Career Options

- Research careers and occupations that interest you and identify the credentials needed to pursue them.
- Enroll in Career and Technical Education (CTE) course offerings connected to your career interests, or look into internship opportunities in your community.



Planning a Course of Study

- Review your endorsement decision to ensure that it aligns with your career interests.
- Enroll in a focused sequence of CTE courses that can lead to industry-based certifications and work-based learning opportunities.



Exploring Career-based Opportunities

- Join a Career and Technical Student Organization where you can apply your career preparation skills through real-world activities.
- Consider participating in summer career skill-building programs hosted by businesses or other organizations.

4. What are the exam schedules for the ACT and SAT? What college exam prep does our district offer?
5. What is the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMQST), and how can I take advantage of it?
6. Where can I find information about summer internships and career skill-building programs?
7. How do I change my endorsement? In Texas, students are allowed to make this change through their 10th grade year. (After this year, I am only able to drop an endorsement.)

DID NOT MEET GRADE LEVEL

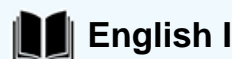

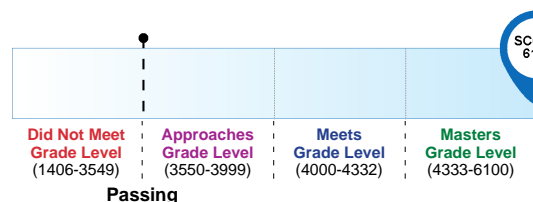

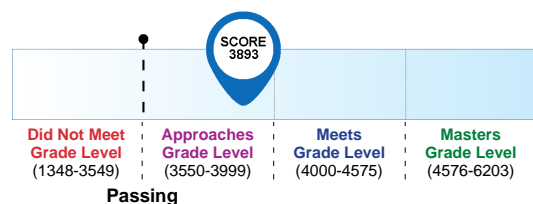

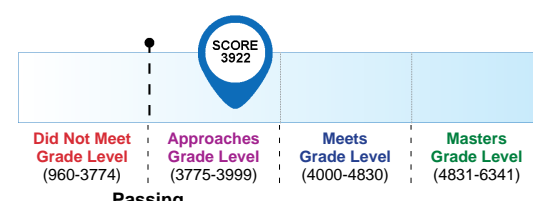

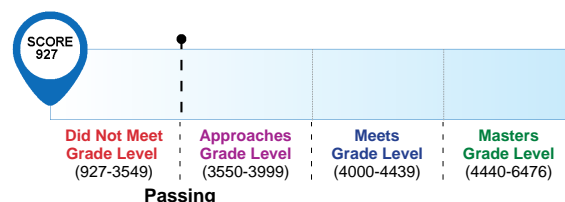
